Year 11 GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Overall Intent:

At KS3, students have experienced a broad and challenging range of reading, writing and talk opportunities, with a particular emphasis in Year 9 on the difference between English then and now, exploring classic texts in preparation for the challenge of GCSE and considering how we use language today to present a viewpoint. At KS4, we want students to apply these concepts further and develop as critical readers, and capable and powerful writers and speakers. KS4 is about students achieving a GCSE English Language grade that reflects their potential and the effort they put in giving them a passport to progress to a choice of destinations, but it should also be a time when students truly invest in reading, writing and talk, and see these disciplines as interrelated – they should read like writers and write like readers.
