OUR LOCAL HERO—Peter Almond

He joined the RAF as a mechanic and after various courses took a test to qualify him for what he thought was training on diesel engines but was in fact a top-secret mission on installing Radar. After training, in the spring of 1941 he was attached to the 518 section to go to Cyprus, but when the situation in Cyprus eased, he was redirected to Singapore, travelling via the West African coast, stopping in Sierra Leone, South Africa then on across the Indian Ocean to Ceylon, through the Bay of Bengal and straits of Malaya before landing in Singapore.

Peter got out of Singapore just before it fell with the rest of his unit, on a ferry bound for Java. They were shelled by a Japanese plane and limped along the coast to Jakarta, and it was there that he was finally captured. Then and for the next 3 and a half years his hell unfolded. There are many stories and many books have been written by others. Peter's full tale cannot be told here but I can give you a few insights:
