A train signaller is a safety-critical role responsible for controlling the movement of trains by operating signals, points, and level crossings from a signal box or control centre. They ensure safe spacing between trains, manage routing, and handle emergencies. The role requires calm decision-making, high concentration, and shift work.

Countdown to Work Experience for Y10s and Y12s

A recent BBC interview with John Boumphrey, Amazon's UK Country Manager, has reignited national discussion about the role of work experience in preparing young people for the world of work. Boumphrey stressed that rising youth unemployment is "a system problem, not a motivation problem", arguing that young people are often unfairly blamed for lacking skills that the education system has not equipped them with.

He highlighted that nearly a million young people in the UK are currently not in education, employment or training, yet large employers like Amazon still struggle to recruit workers with the communication, teamwork and problem-solving skills they need. Boumphrey described work experience as "transformative", giving students the real-world learning that cannot be taught in a classroom. At Thirsk School, we are proud to say that this message is already firmly embedded in our curriculum. All students in Year 10 and Year 12 complete a compulsory week of work experience, giving them the opportunity to develop confidence, resilience and essential employability skills long before they leave education.

We know — and national employers agree — that meaningful work experience helps young people understand expectations, build independence and discover their strengths. We are delighted that our students benefit from this every year, and we remain committed to providing high-quality careers education that prepares them for their futures.
